Mr. and Mrs. Walter Motteram, of Seymour avenue, King's Park, have received a letter card from their son, Sgt. Douglas S. Motteram, who was a POW in Japan. He is in an Australian reception camp at Manila. He is in good health.

Mr. and Mrs. A. Carman, of Second avenue, Glenelg, have received a telegram from their son, Sig. Kevin Carman, stating that he has arrived at Darwin, having flown from Japan. He was a prisoner in Osaka camp, and is reported to be in good health.

Mrs. Thelma Altman, of Kadina, has received official notification that her husband, Pte. Jack Altman, 2 2nd Pioneers, who was taken prisoner in Java in 1942, has been released.

Mrs. H. E. Howell, of Wolseley, has been notified that her son, Lt. R. V. Howell, is safe in Manila. Lt. Howell was a member of 4th Reserve Transport.

Mr. and Mrs. Harry Russell, of Marree, have been notified that their son, Pte. J. H. Russell, was recovered from Japan on September 16, and is safe and well.

Mrs. C. W. Hutton, of Eden Hills, has had official notice of the release of her husband, Pte. Colin Hutton, from Osaka camp, Japan. He is at Manila, and is fit and well, and has just received his first mail. Pte. Hutton is the third son of Mrs. B. Hutton, and his four brothers were also in A.I.F.

Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Nicholls, of Dunbar terrace, Glenelg, have received official advice that their son, L-Cpl. J. H. Nicholls, previously reported POW, is now reported to have been recovered in Manila on September 15. He served in the 2 2nd Reserve MT Coy., and was taken prisoner at Singapore.

Mr. and Mrs. S. E. Kitto, of Adelaide road, North Brighton, have received advice that their son, Cpl. G. J. Kitto, is reported to have been recovered from Japan on September 19.
