

HIS LIFE FOR HIS COUNTRY

Pte. J. E. E. Brodribb, of Sale

Word was received by Mrs. M. Brodribb, 36 Ross Street, Sale, this week that her only son, Pte. J. E. E. Brodribb (A.I.F.), who was previously "reported missing, believed to be a prisoner of war," is now reported as having died of illness as the result of tropical ulcers whilst a prisoner of war.

Pte. Brodribb was born in Sale and was 26 years of age. As a boy he attended the Sale State School and the Sale Technical School.

In 1940 he enlisted at Sale in the A.I.F. and saw service in the Middle East. He was on a boat which called in at Java and was taken by the Japanese. From that time up to the present his mother had received only one letter from him and that is dated February 26, 1942.

Much sympathy is extended to Mrs. Brodribb and her two daughters in their great sacrifice for their country.
