Mr. and Mrs. C. Peachey, Perth, have received a letter card from their son, Leonard, who is a prisoner of war. This would be the first news of him since February, 1942.

Mrs. E. Pennington, "The Valley," Derby, has received a letter card from her son, Dr. L. J. Pennington, stating that he is well. This is the first word she has had from him since the fall of Malaya.
