

MORE MESSAGES FROM SAIGON

Prisoner-of-war messages from Saigon were picked up on Monday night by the Department of Information's listening post, with the standard message: "Am safe and well in British hands. Hope to be home soon. Writing. Reply c/o 2nd Australian Prisoner of War Reception Group." The full list of names of men known to be safe in Saigon has already been published.
