L. Sgt. Michael Brookman, elder son of Mr. and Mrs. George Brookman of Barton terrace, North Adelaide, was killed in action on July 14. Educated at St. Peter's College, he attended the University of Adelaide, where he took his law degree, and was admitted to the Bar at the end of 1938.

Sgt. Air Gunner B. G. Balleine, 26, has been reported missing, believed killed, as a result of air operations during the 1,000 bomber raid over Germany on May 29. Sgt. Balleine, who trained at Somers, Ballarat, and Essendon, left for overseas in May 1941. He was educated at Pennington Public and Woodville High schools. His younger brother Fred was reported missing, believed killed, while on active service with HMAS Parramatta.

Mr and Mrs. E. W. Gregory, of Sturt avenue, Colonel Light Gardens have been informed that their only son, L. Bdr Robert Henry Gregory, died of wounds on July 12. He was educated at Colonel Light Gardens and Goodwood Central schools. He enlisted in June, 1940, and went overseas in November, 1940. Before enlisting he was employed by Julius Cohn & Co., Leigh street, Adelaide.

Mr. and Mrs. Klicke, of Ebor avenue, Torrensville, have been notified that their son, Pte Allan R. Klicke, has been reported missing in Java. He enlisted in May, 1940, in Victoria, and left for overseas in January, 1941. He served in the Middle East. His last letter was dated February 26 from Java. Before enlisting he was a building construction rigger.

Mrs. E. M. Barwick, of Blight street, Croydon, has been notified that her eldest son, Pte C. C. Barwick, has been wounded in action in Egypt. He enlisted at Port Lincoln in January, 1941, and went overseas in April of the same year.

The Rev. R. N. S. Adams, of Clare, has been informed that his youngest son, PO Paul P. Adams, has been reported missing.

Mrs. J. T. Sampson, of Solomontown, has been notified that her brother, Pte Stanley Walter Bonnett, AIF, is reported missing in Malaya. Pte Bonnett, who is
