

CASUALTY LIST

An A.I.F. casualty list issued yesterday contains the name of V.X. Gunner T. W. Steel, Artillery (West Brunswick), who has been placed on the seriously ill list overseas.

Two Victorian members of the A.I.F. have died in Australia. They are V.X. 20216 Private R. Barden, Infantry (East Melbourne), accidentally killed, and V.X. 47908, Private D. H. Maddock, Infantry (Carrum Downs), died of illness. V.X. 37054, Private A. V. Martin, Supply and Transport (Windsor), has been removed from the seriously ill list, and V.1724 Staff Sergeant E. J. Robottom, Infantry (Newport), removed from dangerously ill list.

A New South Wales casualty list contains the names of two A.I.F. men abroad. They are N.X. 14163, Sapper P. J. M. Short, Engineers (Gladesville), dangerously ill, and N.X.10023, Private F. L. Carey, Headquarters Units (Trundle), seriously ill.

Names are also given of one member of the home forces in New South Wales who has died of illness and six members who have been placed on the dangerously ill list.
